**Sec. 2. Effective date.** This Act will become effective when the State Highway Commission determines that funds are available from the General Highway Fund to finance this Act.

## Chapter 440

**AN ACT Providing for Area Directional Signs for Route 6 and Maritime Provinces.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

## Chapter 441

**AN ACT to Conform the Statutes with the Amendments to the Rules of Civil Procedure.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 802, amended.** The first sentence of section 802 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

A practicing attorney who is a resident of another state or territory or of a foreign country may, to the extent permitted by rule of the Supreme Judicial Court, be permitted to practice in a matter before a court of this State, but he shall not be admitted to the general practice of law in this State without complying with section 803.

**Sec. 2. R. S., T. 10, § 1504, amended.** Section 1504 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

**§ 1504. False oath; mandamus to compel recording**

Whoever willfully swears or affirms falsely to any such certificate is guilty of perjury and shall pay treble damages to every party injured thereby. If
