PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS
OF THE
STATE OF MAINE
AS PASSED BY THE
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This Act shall take effect for all the purposes thereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at said meeting; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at said meeting equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all candidates for Governor in said town at the next previous gubernatorial election; but failure of approval by the necessary percentage of voters at any such meeting shall not prevent a subsequent meeting or meetings to be held for said purpose on or before January 1, 1969.

The result of the vote in said district shall be declared by the municipal officers of the Town of Solon and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the clerk of said town with the Secretary of State.

Chapter 44

AN ACT Relating to Fishing for Bass in Sheepscot River and Tributaries, Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 70, repealed and replaced. Section 70 of chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sec. 70. Taking of striped or sea bass in the Sheepscot River. It shall be unlawful to fish for or catch striped or sea bass in the tidal waters of the Sheepscot River and its tributaries, including Back River, Dyer's River, Nichols River, Marsh River and the Marshes, so called, in any manner except by hand line or rod and reel.

Chapter 45

AN ACT Repealing Noncontributory Pension Plan for Police Department of City of Brewer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1927, c. 50, repealed. Chapter 50 of the private and special laws of 1927 is repealed.
