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Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots and blank returns in conformity with the foregoing Act, accompanied by a copy thereof.

## Chapter 157

### AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Aid in Dredging the Saco River.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Appropriating funds to aid in dredging the Saco River.** There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Cities of Saco and Biddeford the sum of \$31,000 to aid said cities to provide for 2 anchorages, 6 feet deep at mean low water, totaling 10½ acres in area near the mouth of the river and a 9-acre maneuvering and anchorage basin at the head of navigation. Such appropriation shall not be available until the sum of \$31,000 has been appropriated by the Cities of Biddeford and Saco for the same purpose and the sum of \$138,000 shall have been made available by the United States under section 107 of the 1960 River and Harbor Act for the same purpose. Such appropriation shall not lapse until June 30, 1969.

## Chapter 158

### AN ACT to Authorize the Plantation of Matinicus Isle to Form a School Administrative District.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, there is a vital need for safe and adequate school facilities on the island; and

Whereas, the State Board of Education may not authorize the island to become a School Administrative District; and

Whereas, it is impossible for the island to join with other municipalities in district formation; and

Whereas, the Revised Statutes of 1964, Title 20, section 212, provides that the Legislature may establish single town administrative districts; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**School Administrative District for Matinicus Isle, authorized.** The Municipality of Matinicus Isle Plantation is exempted from the limitations provided in the Revised Statutes of 1964, Title 20, section 213, and the State Board of Education is authorized to proceed pursuant to sections 214 to 307 to take the necessary action to allow the municipality of Matinicus Isle to form a School Administrative District. Said district shall be authorized to procure secondary education for its pupils at one or more administrative units or with one or more private academies on the mainland. Further, notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the contrary, the Matinicus Isle School Administrative District shall be governed by a board of directors not to exceed 3 in number.

Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed to limit the number of times that Matinicus Isle may make application to the State Board of Education nor shall the authority heretofore granted to the State Board of Education under this Act be limited to any specified number of times for the board to authorize Matinicus Isle to act on the formation of a School Administrative District.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

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## Chapter 159

### AN ACT to Make Allocations from Bond Issue for Construction and Equipment of Pollution Abatement Facilities.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Allocation.** From the proceeds of the sale of bonds for construction and equipment of pollution abatement facilities, from July 1, 1967 to June 30, 1968 and from July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969, shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule:

Any balance shall not lapse but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.

### AN ACT Relating to Computation of State Aid for School Administrative District No. 12 (Jackman and Moose River).

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, School Administrative District No. 12 currently enrolls 191 pupils; and
