Sec. 9. Other sources of funds. This Act shall not in any manner preclude the state board from obtaining construction funds in any other ways or from any other sources; or from accepting from any authorized agency of the Federal Government loans or grants for the planning, construction or acquisition of any project; or from entering into agreements with such agency respecting any such loans or grants.

Sec. 10. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. No action shall be taken or liability incurred under this Act unless and until the electors of the State of Maine shall have ratified the issuance of bonds in behalf of the State at such time and in such amounts as set forth in this Act for the purpose of constructing student housing and dining facilities at the state colleges and vocational technical institutes.

Referendum for ratification. The aldermen of cities, the selectmen of towns and the assessors of the several plantations of this State are empowered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet in the manner prescribed by law for calling and holding biennial meetings of said inhabitants for the election of Senators and Representatives at the next general or special state-wide election to give in their votes upon the acceptance or rejection of the foregoing Act, and the question shall be:

“Shall ‘An Act to Authorize Construction of Self-Liquidating Student Housing and Dining Facilities for the State Colleges and Vocational Technical Institutes and the Issuance of Not Exceeding \$6,715,000 Bonds of the State of Maine for the Financing Thereof’; passed by the 103rd Legislature, be accepted?”

The inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall vote by ballot on said question and shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words “Yes” or “No” their opinion of the same. The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings, and return made to the office of the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for Governor and Members of the Legislature, and the Governor and Council shall review the same, and if it shall appear that a majority of the inhabitants voting on the question are in favor of the Act, the Governor shall forthwith make known the fact by his proclamation, and the Act shall become effective in 30 days after the date of said proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots and blank returns in conformity with the foregoing Act, accompanied by a copy thereof.

Chapter 169

AN ACT Providing for Paid Holidays for Municipal Employees and Relating to Duties of Department of Public Works of the City of Lewiston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. X, § 2, amended. Section 2 of Article X of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2. Certain duties of board. The department of public works shall be charged with responsibility for the construction, maintenance and repairs of streets, bridges, sidewalks and sewers; lighting of streets, public buildings and places; water supply; control and maintenance of public parks and lands; control, maintenance and repairs of all public buildings, except buildings occupied by the school department and the fire department during their actual period of occupancy; and disposal of ashes, garbage and rubbish.

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XIV, § 3, amended. Section 3 of Article XIV of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939 is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3. Management and operation of city farm; public cemeteries. The department of health and welfare shall be charged with the management and operation of the city farm so long as it shall be maintained as such, the promotion of the public health, the supervision of plumbing including the enforcement of laws and ordinances relating thereto, ~~the disposal of garbage~~ and the control, care and maintenance of public cemeteries.

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 8, Art. XVI, § 1-A, repealed and replaced. Section 1-A of Article XVI of chapter 8 of the private and special laws of 1939, as enacted by chapter 110 of the private and special laws of 1965, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sec. 1-A. Paid holidays. Municipal employees shall have the following paid holidays: New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Patriots Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. If and when any one or all of the aforesaid holidays shall fall on a day or days when said municipal employees are off duty as a part of their regular shift, or when holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday, then those employees shall be paid for said holiday or holidays in addition to their regular time off. The holiday pay scale for all members of the Lewiston fire department shall be $\frac{1}{5}$ of their average weekly salary.

Chapter 170

AN ACT to Authorize Bond Issue in the Amount of Four Hundred and Fifteen Thousand Dollars for Construction of a Multi-purpose Building at Fort Kent State College.

Preamble. Two-thirds of both Houses of Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with Section 14 of Article IX of the Constitution to authorize the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine for construction of a multi-purpose building at Fort Kent State College.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Issue of bonds to provide for construction of a multi-purpose building at Fort Kent State College. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the direction of the Governor and Council, to issue from time to time serial coupon bonds in the name and behalf of the State to an amount not exceeding \$415,000
