Chapter 6

RESOLVE, Changing Name of Muddy River Pond to Sebago Cove.

Muddy River Pond; name changed. Resolved: That Muddy River Pond, Cumberland County, be hereafter officially named and referred to as Sebago Cove.

Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Authorizing Marcella Levasseur to Bring Action Against the State of Maine.

Marcella Levasseur, authorized to sue the State of Maine. Resolved: That Marcella Levasseur of Van Buren in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine, who suffered on the 29th day of November, 1964 serious personal injuries while driving an automobile, together with her 2 sons, John, age 13 and Phillip, age 9, both of whom were also injured, on a Maine highway, to wit: on Main Street in said Van Buren approaching the Violette Brook Bridge in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine, due, as she claims, to negligence of the State Highway Commission in not sanding the hill and in not providing adequate guardrails, be and is authorized to bring an action in the Superior Court for the County of Aroostook within one year from the effective date of this resolve, against the State of Maine for damages, if any, for negligence, if any, of the State of Maine, and the complaint issuing out of said Superior Court under the authority of this resolve shall be served on the Secretary of State by attested copy by the sheriff or either of his deputies in any county of the State of Maine; and the conduct of said action shall be according to the practice of actions and proceedings between parties in said Superior Court and the liabilities of the parties and elements of damage, if any, shall be the same as the liabilities and elements of damage between individuals; and the Attorney General is authorized and designated to appear, answer and defend said action. Any judgment that may be recovered in such action shall be payable from the General Highway Fund of the State of Maine on final process issued by said Superior Court, or if appealed, the Supreme Judicial Court, and costs may be

taxed for the said Marcella Levasseur if she recovers in said action. Hearing thereon shall be before a Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court or the Superior Court without a jury; and said justice to be assigned by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court.

Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Waters in Franklin County.

Fishing in certain waters in Franklin County; regulated. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Long Pond, Sandy River Plantation, permitting fly fishing and trolling only, except that bait fishing is permitted from a permanent wharf or shore after May 20th. The daily limit shall be 4 fish and the tributaries shall be open to fly fishing only.

Chapter 9

RESOLVE, Designating Dresser-Farwell Mountain in Oxford County.

Dresser-Farwell Mountain, designated. Resolved: That the unnamed mountain in the northwest corner of Batchelder's Grant, Oxford County, Maine shall be officially designated as, and henceforth referred to, as Dresser-Farwell Mountain.

Chapter 10

RESOLVE, Authorizing State Highway Commission to Study Desirability of Bridge Across New Meadows River.

Bridge across New Meadows River, study authorized. Resolved: That the State Highway Commission is authorized and directed to make a study of the need and cost of a highway bridge with necessary highway approaches thereto across New Meadows River on now or formerly Route 1 between the Towns of Brunswick and West Bath, in the County of Sagadahoc, to provide better drainage of water from New Meadows Lake and thereby terminating a polluted condition now existent; and be it further

Resolved: That the State Highway Commission is authorized and directed to make a study of the need and costs of enlarging the opening in the causeway and bridge across New Meadows River on Route 1A between the Town of Brunswick and the City of Bath which is a contributing factor to the polluted water of New Meadows Lake; and be it further
