**RESOLVE, to Reimburse Town of Hanover for Aid Extended Floyd Merrill.**

**Town of Hanover; reimbursed. Resolved:** That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$475 to be paid to the Town of Hanover to reimburse the town for support of Floyd Merrill.

## Chapter 55

**RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of One Hundred Copies of "Pittsfield on the Seabasticook".**

**Pittsfield on the Seabasticook; purchase of. Resolved:** That the State purchase 100 copies of the book entitled "Pittsfield on the Seabasticook" by Sanger Mills Cook at \$5 per copy; said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the State Librarian; and be it further

**Resolved:** That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$500 for this purpose.

## Chapter 56

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Herbert Parsons of Gorham.**

**Herbert Parsons; reimbursed. Resolved:** That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$642.90, to be paid to Herbert Parsons of Gorham, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for destruction of his car by an escapee from the Men's Reformatory at Windham.
