5. Spouse of member of Armed Forces. A spouse of a member of the Armed Forces on active duty may have the same residence for voting purposes as his or her spouse.

Chapter 49

AN ACT Relating to Delegation of Authority to Director of Bureau of Corrections Under New England Interstate Corrections Compact.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 34, § 1343, amended. Section 1343 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 1343. Powers

The Commissioner of Mental Health and Corrections is authorized and directed to do all things necessary or incidental to the carrying out of the compact in every particular and he may in his discretion delegate this authority to the ~~Warden of the Maine State Prison~~ Director of the Bureau of Corrections.

Chapter 50

AN ACT Relating to Cooperative Agreements by the Public Utilities Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 35, § 1558, amended. The 4th sentence of section 1558 of Title 35 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 136 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

The commission shall have the power and authority to enter into and make cooperative agreements with the Interstate Commerce Commission and the Department of Transportation to enforce the economic and safety laws and regulations of the United States and this State concerning highway transportation.
