Chapter 200

AN ACT Relating to Appropriating Money by Municipalities for Ambulance Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 30, § 5105, sub-§ 7, amended. Subsection 7 of section 5105 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 7. Ambulance. Providing for a public ambulance and garage for it, or supporting an ambulance service serving its residents.

Chapter 201

AN ACT Relating to Taking Possession of Animals Unlawfully Detained.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 17, § 1176, amended. Section 1176 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- § 1176. Officers may take possession of animals unlawfully detained; lien

Any sheriff, deputy sheriff, police officer, constable, officer of any society for the prevention of cruelty to animals state humane agent or other person authorized to make arrests may take possession of any animals detained in violation of this chapter and may unload the same, comfortably yard or shelter, feed, water and care for them and have a lien thereon for a reasonable sum for such care, and is not liable for any damages for detention of the same.
