Chapter 321

AN ACT Permitting Acceptance of Personal Recognizances by Allagash Wilderness Waterway Rangers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 675, amended. Section 675 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 496 of the public laws of 1965, is amended by adding at the end, 2 new paragraphs, as follows:

Authorized agents or representatives of the commission making an arrest for any violation of this chapter may accept the personal recognizance of the prisoner in a sum not exceeding \$250 and a deposit in money to the amount of the recognizance for his appearance before the appropriate District or Superior Court on a specified date. The authorized agent or representative shall forthwith report all such recognizances and forward all such deposits to the court to which the recognizance is returnable.

If such person fails to appear in court on the day specified either in person or by counsel, the court shall order the recognizance and money deposited forfeited and shall enter such person's default, and shall notify the commission of the default and forfeiture.

Chapter 322

AN ACT Relating to Bids for Construction of State Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1746, amended. The first sentence of the 2nd paragraph of section 1746 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by chapter 437 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

Under any contract made or awarded by the State or by any public department or official thereof, including the construction, improvement or repair of any and all ways, roads or bridges with appurtenances which, by law, are under the supervision of the State Highway Commission, the contractor may, from time to time, withdraw the whole or any portion of the amount retained for payments to the contractor pursuant to the terms of the contract, upon depositing with the Treasurer of State: **A negotiable certificate of deposit**, United States treasury bonds, United States treasury notes, United States treasury certificates of indebtedness, United States treasury bills, or bonds or notes of the State of Maine or bonds of any political subdivision in the State of Maine.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 23, § 753, amended. The 4th sentence of section 753 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Each bidder must accompany his bid with an official bank check, a cashier's check, a certified check, a certificate of deposit or a United States postal money order, payable to the Treasurer of State, for an amount which the commission considers sufficient to guarantee that if the work is awarded to him he will contract with the commission for its due execution.

Chapter 323

AN ACT Relating to Fee for Breweries and Wholesale Outlets to Sell Malt Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 604, amended. The last sentence of the first paragraph of section 604 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

The fee therefor shall be ~~\$300~~ \$500 per year, which sum shall accompany the application for such certificate.

Chapter 324

AN ACT Creating the Uniform Limited Partnership Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 31, c. 7, additional. Title 31 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter 7, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 7

UNIFORM LIMITED PARTNERSHIP ACT
