8. Fees. The board will establish reasonable fees for licenses, license renewals and examinations and such fees shall be credited to the General Fund.

9. Compensation. Members of the board will be paid \$20 a day for time necessarily spent in official duties, plus reimbursement for necessary expenditures incurred in the conduct of official business.

§ 64. Appeals

Any person who is aggrieved by the decision of the board in refusing to issue a license or the renewal of a license may file a statement of complaint with the Administrative Hearing Commissioner designated in Title 5, chapters 301 to 307.

Chapter 351

AN ACT Relating to Expenditures from Aeronautical Fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 36, § 2912, amended. The 6th sentence of section 2912 of Title 36 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 21 of chapter 425 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

~~The~~ With the approval of the Governor and Council, the Aeronautics Commission is authorized and directed to expend so much of the Aeronautical Fund as may be necessary for the purposes of carrying out the duties imposed upon it by law and to expend any unexpended balance in such fund toward the development and promotion of aviation, and to assist in construction, repair and the maintenance of, and the removal of snow from, municipal, state, county and federal airports in this State, and assist in the construction and maintenance of a system of air marking, in such manner and in such amounts as it shall deem equitable.
