Chapter 392

AN ACT Relating to Posting Bonds by Defendants Under the Uniform Paternity Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 19, § 282, amended. Section 282 of Title 19 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 325 of the public laws of 1967, is amended to read as follows:

§ 282. Security

~~The~~ Upon complaint of the mother the court may at any time require the alleged father to give bond or other security for the payment of the judgment.

Chapter 393

AN ACT Providing for Androscoggin County Funds for Child and Family Mental Health Services.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 30, § 412, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 412 to read as follows:

§ 412. Androscoggin County — child and family mental health services

The county commissioners of Androscoggin County shall expend county funds to operate programs for child and family services.
