Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Authorization. The school directors of School Administrative District No. 70 composed of the residents of and the territory within the Towns of Amity, Haynesville and Hodgdon and Cary Plantation, are authorized to issue bonds or notes of said district for capital outlay purposes not exceeding the principal amount of \$900,000 to construct an elementary school in the Town of Hodgdon, without the necessity of further proceedings in the member towns. The proceedings taken in the district meeting held in the member Towns of Amity, Haynesville and Hodgdon and Cary Plantation on October 20, 1969, and all action heretofore taken pursuant thereto by the school directors, officers and agents of said district are confirmed, validated and made effective.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 229

AN ACT Ratifying Deed Given by the State to International Paper Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Deed given by the State to International Paper Company ratified. The deed given by the State of Maine to International Paper Company, dated January 5, 1970, is hereby ratified.

Chapter 230

AN ACT Transferring Funds for Educational Subsidy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Educational Subsidy: appropriated funds transferred. That part of the appropriations from the General Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970 for the Department of Education as enacted by the private and special laws of 1969, chapter 121, is adjusted as follows:

*Any unexpended balance of Industrial Education Subsidies, Vocational Education Subsidies, and Regional Technical and Vocational Center Subsidies appropriations shall not lapse at the end of the 1969-70 fiscal year but shall be carried forward to the 1970-71 fiscal year to be expended for the same purposes.

Chapter 231

AN ACT Extending the Term of the Maine State Sesquicentennial Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1967, c. 165, § 1, amended. The last paragraph of section 1 of chapter 165 of the private and special laws of 1967 is amended to read as follows:

All members shall be appointed for terms to expire ~~December 31, 1970~~ **June 30, 1971**, and vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments were made.

Chapter 232

AN ACT to Authorize the Issuance of Bonds in the Amount of Nineteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars on Behalf of the State of Maine to Build State Highways.

Preamble. Two-thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution, Article IX, Section 14, to authorize
