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## Chapter 254

### AN ACT to Appropriate Moneys for Necessary Items and Miscellaneous Changes for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1970 and June 30, 1971.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment; and

Whereas, the items included in this Act are urgently needed; and

Whereas, in order to accomplish the greatest possible improvement in the indicated programs to meet the total needs of the people of the State of Maine, it is vitally necessary that they be provided as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Appropriations for the necessary expenditures of State Government.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of State Government for the next 2 fiscal years, ending June 30, 1970 and June 30, 1971, the following sums or as much thereof as shall be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulation, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the General Fund Unappropriated Surplus not otherwise appropriated. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

Any unencumbered balances remaining at June 30, 1971 shall lapse.

Provides \$50,000 for a start on renewal and enlargement of the Electrical Distribution System and Vault. Also provides \$20,000 for minor repairs and remodeling of the 4th floor of the State House to make available more space for the Legislature and its staff.

Reduces eight count positions and appropriation due to Chapter 132 Public Laws 1969. Undedicated Revenue will be reduced \$16,000 in 1969-70 and \$83,654 in 1970-71. Also provides funds for Deputy Insurance Commissioner Reclassification.

**SECTION C**

All Other allocations of the Liquor Commission shall be increased by \$31,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1970 to supplement moneys available for roof repairs.

**SECTION D**

**P. & S. L., 1969, c. 194, § 6, amended.** Section 6 of chapter 194 of the private and special laws of 1969, under the caption MENTAL HEALTH AND CORRECTIONS, DEPARTMENT OF, Boys Training Center, is amended to read as follows:

**Referendum for ratification.** The aldermen of cities, the selectmen of towns and the assessors of the several plantations of this State are empowered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet in the manner prescribed by law for calling and holding biennial meetings of said inhabitants for the election of Senators and Representatives, at the next primary election June 15, 1970 to give in their votes upon the acceptance or rejection of Section D of the foregoing Act, and the question shall be:

“Shall the moneys appropriated for an addition to the Gould Academic Building at the Boys Training Center be used for the construction of educational classrooms at the Boys Training Center, passed by the First Special Session of the 104th Legislature?”

The inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed within a square upon their ballots their opinion of the same, those in favor of ratification voting “Yes” and those opposed to ratification voting “No” and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings, and return made to the office of the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for Governor and Members of the Legislature, and the Governor and Council shall review the same and if it shall appear that a majority of the inhabitants voting on the question are in favor of said Section D of this Act the Governor shall forthwith make known the fact by his proclamation, and Section D of this Act shall thereupon become effective in 30 days after the date of said proclamation.

**Secretary of State shall prepare ballots.** The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations ballots and blank return in conformity with Section D of the foregoing Act, accompanied by a copy thereof.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
