Chapter 28

AN ACT Repealing Bond for Liquor Licensees of Hotels, Clubs and Restaurants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 803, repealed. Section 803 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed.

Effective September 23, 1971

Chapter 29

AN ACT Repealing the Requirement of Notarizing Applications for Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 251, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 251 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Intentionally untruthful answers in applications for licenses shall constitute the crime of perjury.

Chapter 30

AN ACT Relating to Mental Illness and Mental Retardation of Persons in State Penal, Correctional and Juvenile Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 34, § 135, repealed and replaced. Section 135 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 135. Physical and mental examination of inmates

The department may require a physical and mental examination of persons committed to any state penal or correctional institution or training center for juvenile offenders. It shall designate competent examiners employed by the department or who may be employed by the department to conduct such examinations.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 34, § 136, repealed. Section 136 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is repealed.
