pital and Training Center. Admission shall be effected in accordance with section 2152.

A copy of the document by which any such person is held in the State Prison, correctional center or juvenile institution shall accompany the application for admission.

If the sentence being served at the time of admission has not expired or commitment has not been terminated in accordance with law at the time any such person is ready for discharge from the Pineland Hospital and Training Center, he shall be returned by the appropriate officers of the State Prison, correctional center or juvenile institution.

If, at the time of expiration of the original sentence or termination of the commitment it is the opinion of the Superintendent of the Pineland Hospital and Training Center that such patient should remain in residence at the Pineland Hospital and Training Center after expiration of sentence, or termination of commitment, such patient may be readmitted to the Pineland Hospital and Training Center in accordance with section 2152.

Admission to a hospital under this section shall have no effect upon a sentence then being served or commitment then in effect. Such sentence shall continue to run and any such commitment shall remain in force, unless terminated in accordance with law.

Chapter 31

AN ACT Relating to Falsely Assuming to be an Officer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 1451, repealed and replaced. Section 1451 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

§ 1451. Falsely assuming to be an officer

Whoever falsely assumes to be or impersonates a justice of the peace, notary public, health officer, state humane agent or any law enforcement officer, or who falsely acts as such, or who requires anyone to aid him in a matter pertaining to the duties of any such office which he does not hold, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.
