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19. Piscataquis River, main stem, from the railroad bridge approximately 1 mile east of Merrill Brook confluence to the bridge at East Dover—Class ~~D~~ C.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 38, § 369, amended. Subsection 24 of that part of section 369 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes which relates to Washington County is amended to read as follows:

24. Unnamed Stream entering tidewater portion of St. Croix River at Calais crossing North Street between Beech and Union Streets—Class ~~D~~ C.

Sec. 3. Time schedule. The time schedule for compliance with the foregoing reclassifications shall be as set forth in the Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 451, subsection 1, as amended.

Chapter 139

AN ACT Exempting Kents Hill School from the Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 5, § 1001, sub-§ 18, amended. Subsection 18 of section 1001 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

18. **Public school.** "Public school" shall mean any public school conducted within the State under the authority and supervision of a duly elected board of education, superintending school committee or school directors, and any school which received any direct state aid in 1950, and municipal tuition funds amounting to at least the amount of such state aid, during the same year, except that **Maine Wesleyan Seminary & College, commonly known as Kents Hill School, as of the effective date of this Act, shall be excluded from such coverage as is extended by the Maine State Retirement System.**

Chapter 140

AN ACT Relating to Issuance of Malt Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 701, amended. The 4th paragraph from the end of section 701 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

All full-year licenses shall be issued for ~~the license one year and on a calendar year basis~~ from date of issuance and the prescribed fee shall accompany the application for license.

Chapter 141

AN ACT Prohibiting Beaver Trapping by Nonresidents:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2360, amended. Section 2360 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, is further amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

Notwithstanding any other provision of law nonresidents shall not be permitted to trap beaver in this State.

Chapter 142

AN ACT Relating to Operation of Snowmobiles in Cemeteries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 1978, sub-§ 9-A, additional. Section 1978 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 414 of the public laws of 1969, is amended by adding a new subsection 9-A, to read as follows:

9-A. Operation in cemeteries. It shall be unlawful to operate any snowmobile in any cemetery or burying ground. Any person who violates this subsection shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$150, plus any damage to the memorials located in said cemetery, which was caused by snowmobiles. This subsection shall not apply to any person who is licensed under Title 32, chapter 21 by the Board of Funeral Service to engage in the funeral service profession, in conducting his profession.
