Sec. 2. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that this Act shall in no way affect the tenure of the present members of the Land Damage Board.

Chapter 190

AN ACT Prohibiting Discrimination for Testifying or Asserting Claim Under Workmen's Compensation Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 39, § III, additional. Title 39 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section III, to read as follows:

§ III. Discrimination

No employee shall be discriminated against by any employer in any way for testifying or asserting any claim under this Act. Any employer who so discriminates against any employee shall be liable to such employee on petition before the commission and hearing before the commission, for all net wages lost suffered by such employee by reason of such discrimination.

Chapter 191

AN ACT Relating to Length of Combination of Motor Vehicles and Semitrailers Transporting Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 244, amended. The 4th paragraph from the end of section 244 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 54 of the public laws of 1967, is further amended by adding a new sentence at the end to read as follows:

However, a combination of motor vehicle and semitrailer exclusively engaged in the transportation of motor vehicles shall be allowed to attain a maximum length of 55 feet, excluding the usual or ordinary bumper overhang of the transported vehicles.
