licensed to do so by the department. The initial license fee and the annual renewal license fee shall be \$10. Except that fire departments shall be exempt from the licensing requirements of sections 1566 to 1571 so long as the use of the apparatus is restricted to departmental use in fighting fires.

§ 1569. Fees

All fees shall be collected by the department and remitted to the Treasurer of State and credited to the General Fund.

§ 1570. Rules and regulations

The department shall have the authority to promulgate rules and regulations as are necessary to promptly and effectively enforce sections 1566 to 1571.

§ 1571. Penalty

Whoever violates any of the provisions of sections 1566 to 1571 or any rules and regulations made thereunder shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or by both.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare the sum of \$2,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Chapter 522

AN ACT Relating to Funeral Expenses of Recipients of Public Assistance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 22, § 3409, amended. Section 3409 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 3409. Funeral expenses

On the death of an active recipient of aid to the aged, blind or disabled, reasonable funeral expenses not exceeding \$150 \$200 shall be paid by the State if the estate of the deceased is insufficient to pay the same.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare the sum of \$40,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Chapter 523

AN ACT Providing for Full-time Offices for Registration and Licenses for Operation of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 29, § 51-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 51-A, to read as follows:

§ 51-A. Offices

The Secretary of State shall maintain 4 additional full-time offices at convenient places in the State as he deems necessary to carry out his duties relating to applications for registration of and licenses for the operation of motor vehicles.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Highway Fund to the Secretary of State, Motor Vehicle Division, the sum of \$203,054 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
