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The representative of the Highway Commission shall be chairman pro tem to call an organizational meeting. The committee shall elect a chairman and such other officers as it wants.

Any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

**Sec. 2. Duties.** The committee shall:

1. Hire an architect to design, prepare plans and specifications and supervise construction of a tourist information center at Kittery.
2. The building shall be designed to be compatible with the Highway Commission rest facilities to be erected in the area.
3. Contract for the construction and equipping of such tourist information center.

**Sec. 3. Term and compensation.** The committee shall continue in existence for one year after the information center is completed and accepted by the committee. Members of the committee shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses at the same rates as provided for state employees.

**Sec. 4. Termination.** When the information center is completed it shall be turned over to the Property Management Division of the Bureau of Public Improvements for maintenance. Any funds in the Department of Economic Development budget for operation and maintenance of the present building shall be used for the same purpose with the new building.

**Sec. 5. Appropriation.** There is appropriated to the Kittery Information Center Building Committee from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$175,000 to carry out the purposes of this Act. Any balance at June 30, 1971 shall not lapse but shall carry forward until the purpose for which the appropriation is made shall be accomplished.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

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## Chapter 81

### AN ACT Making Additional Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1971.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses necessary to the operation of departments and institutions will become due and payable before July 1, 1971; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the month of May the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulation, are appropriated out of any moneys in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund not otherwise appropriated or provided by law. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, together with expenditures for other purposes necessary to the conduct of State Government on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.
