Chapter 114**AN ACT to Make Allocations from Bond Issue for Construction, Planning and Equipment of Pollution Abatement Facilities.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Allocation. From the proceeds of the sale of bonds for planning, construction and equipment of pollution abatement facilities, from July 1, 1971 to June 30, 1972 and from July 1, 1972 to June 30, 1973, there shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule:

Any unexpended balance shall not lapse, but shall be carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.

Chapter 115**AN ACT Making Additional Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1971.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses necessary to the operation of the Department of Health and Welfare will become due and payable before July 1, 1971; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government and for other purposes for the month of June the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulation, are appropriated out of any moneys in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund not otherwise appropriated or provided by law.
