RESOLVES
OF THE
STATE OF MAINE
AS PASSED BY THE
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simple to Brown Company the parcel of land in Township 6, north of Weld, in Franklin County, Maine, described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of the public lots in said Township No. 6 marked by a spruce post marked "Public Lot— R 11—R 10 1928 W. P.," which post stands on the division line of the township at a point 315 rods, 18 links, S 0° 30' E from the northwest corner of said public lots marked by a spruce post marked "Public Lot— R 10 R 11—1928 W. P.;" thence N 75° 30' E, 329 rods, 17 links to the southeast corner of said public lots marked by a spruce post marked "No. 5 R. 8, R. 8, R. 9 Public Lot;" thence N 2° 15' W, 315 rods, 21 links to the northeast corner of said public lots marked by a spruce post, marked "No. 8-R, 8, Public Lot, 1928 W.P. R. 9;" thence diagonally across said public lots in a generally southwesterly direction to the southwest corner, the point of beginning, being the southeast triangle of said public lots and containing approximately 320 acres and constituting 1/2 of said public lots. The foregoing premises are shown on plan entitled "Plan of Public Lot, Township No. 6, Franklin County, Maine" recorded in Plan Book 5A, page 26 1/2, Land Office Records, State of Maine, and reference is made to the survey thereof by "W.E. Percival and Party, September-November 1928" on file in vol. no. 8, pp. 70 and 71 of the Public Lot Field Notes in the Forestry Department of the State of Maine, including in said conveyance the right of reasonable access to said premises across the remaining 1/2 of said public lots, reserving to the State of Maine the right to designate from time to time a reasonable route for such access, in exchange for a conveyance by Brown Company to the State of Maine of all of its right, title and interest in and to said remaining 1/2 of said public lots, by deed in form and substance satisfactory to the Forest Commissioner and the recording of such deed in the Franklin County Registry of Deeds shall fully evidence the Forest Commissioner's approval thereof.

Chapter 10

RESOLVE, Designating a Certain Road in Northeastern Maine as John F. McDevitt Road.

John F. McDevitt Road; designated. Resolved: That in recognition of the outstanding and unselfish service rendered in the conservation of our natural resources by John F. McDevitt the following road shall be named the John F. McDevitt Road: Beginning on the northerly side of Route 9 in the Town of Beddington, Washington County; thence running through Township 29, Middle Division, Washington County, through Township 28, Middle Division, Hancock County, through Township 34, Middle Division, Hancock County, through Plantation 33, Hancock County, through Township 32, Middle Division, Hancock County, to Crocker Turn in the Town of Greenfield, Penobscot County. Suitable signs designating the said John F. McDevitt Road may be erected and maintained at no expense to the State and subject to the approval of the State Highway Commission.

Chapter 11

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Clarence Eldridge of Liberty for Loss of Sheep Killed by Dogs.

Clarence Eldridge; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Dog Tax Fund the sum of \$75 to be paid to Clarence Eldridge of Liberty, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for 5 sheep killed by dogs.
