CHAPTER 39

AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Buying or Receiving Stolen Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 17, § 3551, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 3551 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 1. Value does not exceed \$500. If the value thereof does not exceed \$100 \$500, by a fine of not more than \$100 \$500 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months;
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 17, § 3551, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 3551 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- 2. Value exceeds \$500. If the value thereof exceeds \$100 \$500, by a fine of not more than \$500 \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 5 years.

CHAPTER 40

AN ACT Repealing Certain Exemptions from Weekly Payment of Wages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 26, § 623, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 623 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes is repealed as follows:

The provision for weekly payment of wages shall not apply to an employee engaged in cutting and hauling logs and lumber, nor the driving of the same until it reaches its place of destination for sale or manufacture.

CHAPTER 41

AN ACT Relating to Animal Disease Appraisal and Indemnity.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 7, § 1756, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 1756 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Maximum indemnity payments shall be determined by the commissioner, taking into consideration indemnities paid by the United States Department
