## CHAPTER 312

## AN ACT Creating Aroostook County Commissioner Districts.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 105-A, additional. Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 105-A to read as follows:

§ 105-A. Creation of Aroostook County Commissioner Districts

Aroostook County shall be divided into the following 3 districts:

Commissioner District number one consisting of the municipalities and unorganized territories of Amity, Bancroft, Benedicta, Blaine, Bridgewater, Castle Hill, Cary Pt., Chapman, Cox Patent, Crystal, Dyer Brook, Dudley, E Pt., Hammond Pt., Haynesville, Hersey, Hodgdon, Houlton, Island Falls, Linneus, Littleton, Ludlow, Macwahoc Pt., Mapleton, Mars Hill, Merrill, Monticello, Moro Pt., Molunkus, New Limerick, Oakfield, Orient, Reed Pt., Sherman, Smyrna, Westfield, Weston, Silver Ridge Twp., TAR2, TAR5 (Molunkus), TCR2, TDR2, T1R4 (North Yarmouth Academy Grant), T1R4 (Upper Molunkus), 1R5, 2R4, 3R2, 3R3, 3R4, 4R3, 7R3, 7R4 (Webbertown), 7R5, 8R3, 8R4 (St. Croix), 8R5, 9R3, 9R4, 9R5, 10R3, 10R4 (Squapan), 11R4 WELS.

Commissioner District number 2 consisting of the municipalities and unorganized territories of Allagash Pt., Ashland, Caribou, Eagle Lake, Easton, Ft. Commissioner District number 3 consisting of the municipalities and unorganized territories of Caswell Pt., Connor, Cyr Pt., Fort Kent, Frenchville, Grand Isle, Hamlin Pt., Limestone, Madawaska, New Sweden, St. Agatha, Stockholm, Van Buren and Woodland.

Sec. 2. Transition. The transition of the Aroostook County district system shall be made in the following manner: In 1974 a commissioner resident of district 3 shall be elected by the qualified electors of that district. In 1976 a commissioner resident of district 2 shall be elected by the qualified electors of that district. In 1978 a commissioner resident of district one shall be elected by the qualified electors of that district. Thereafter, elections shall continue in a manner so that each district shall at all times have a commissioner elected from the district on the board.
