(5) The provisions of subsections (2), (3) and (4) shall not apply to sales of new or unused consumer goods or services. Any language, oral or written, used by a seller or manufacturer of consumer goods and services, which attempts to exclude or modify any implied warranties or merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose or to exclude or modify the consumer's remedies for breach of those warranties, shall be unenforceable. Consumer goods and services are those goods and services, including mobile homes, which are used or bought primarily for personal, family or household purposes.

(a) A violation of sections 2-314, 2-315 or 2-316, arising from the retail sale of consumer goods and services, shall constitute a violation of Title 5, chapter 10, Unfair Trade Practices Act.

CHAPTER 445

AN ACT to Amend the Municipal Official Conflict of Interest Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 2251, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 2251 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

1. **Voting.** ~~Where it would be decisive, the~~ The vote by any official of a municipality in his official position on any question in which he has a direct or an indirect pecuniary interest is void.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 30, § 2251, sub-§ 4, repealed. Subsection 4 of section 2251 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 247 of the public laws of 1967, is repealed.

CHAPTER 446

AN ACT to Clarify the Industrialized Housing Act as it Relates to Mobile Homes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 30, § 4773, sub-§ 8, additional. Section 4773 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 456 of the public laws of 1971, is amended by adding a new subsection 8 to read as follows:

8. **Mobile home.** "Mobile home" means an industrialized house which is equipped with the necessary service connections and made so as to be readily movable as a unit on its own running gear and designed to be used as a dwelling unit without permanent foundation, but capable of being permanently plumbed.
