CHAPTER 685

AN ACT Relating to Organizational Change in Department of Transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 23, § 4206, sub-§ 2, ¶ A, amended. Paragraph A of subsection 2 of section 4206 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 16 of chapter 593 of the public laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:
 - A. Bureau of Administration Administrative Services;

CHAPTER 686

AN ACT Relating to the Land Damage Board.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 23, § 152, amended. The last sentence of the 4th paragraph of section 152 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

A reporter shall record hearings when required by the board.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 23, § 156, amended. The 7th sentence of the first paragraph of section 156 of Title 23 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 22 of chapter 593 of the public laws of 1971, is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

In all matters where a verbatim record of the proceedings is made by an official board reporter, a transcript of the same shall be furnished to the interested parties, upon request, and upon payment of a reasonable charge for transcribing and preparing such record.

AN ACT to Make Public Utilities Commissioners Full Time.
