CHAPTER 93**AN ACT to Institute a Priority Program Budget System.**

Preamble; legislative findings of fact. Whereas, detailed scrutiny of the State Budget would promote efficiency and economy; and

Whereas, greater accountability of and responsibility by agency and departmental heads in the preparation of their individual budgets is a goal of efficient management; and

Whereas, assignment of priorities to programs is a valuable tool to the Legislature in determining needs of State Government; and

Whereas, it is the belief of the Legislature that efficiencies and savings may well be realized from the establishment of a comprehensive system of budget preparation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Intent. The Members of the 106th Legislature endorse the concept of a priority program budget system, as an effective procedure to improve the preparation, analysis, implementation and administration of the fiscal operations of the State.

Sec. 2. Assistance. All department heads, bureau chiefs and other state officials responsible for budget preparation are directed to assist by all means possible the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and any special committees that may be formed by the executive for the consideration and implementation of the priority program budget system.

CHAPTER 94**AN ACT to Authorize Oxford County to Raise Money for the Development of an Airport in the Rumford-Mexico Area.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Development of airport, Rumford-Mexico. The county commissioners of the County of Oxford are authorized to send to the people of the County of Oxford the following referendum question: Shall the county raise, by bonds, and expend a sum not to exceed \$107,500 for cost of developing an airport in the Rumford-Mexico area. This referendum shall occur at the next general or special state election after the following provisions have been met as determined by the Oxford County Commissioners:

1. Approval of a site by the Federal Aviation Authority;
2. Final cost estimates of the project have been approved by the Federal Aviation Authority;
