CHAPTER 131

AN ACT Appropriating Funds to Continue Emergency Employment Act Services at Bangor State Hospital.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Bangor State Hospital; appropriation. There is appropriated to the Bangor State Hospital from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$78,733.20 to continue certain positions at the Bangor State Hospital which may not receive funding under the Emergency Employment Act. In the event funds are continued under the Emergency Employment Act this appropriation shall lapse. The breakdown of expenditures shall be as follows:

Provides for 5 cooks, 2 laborers and one statistician now employed under the Emergency Employment Act.

CHAPTER 132

AN ACT Authorizing a Business Manager for the Department of the Attorney General.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and Resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the said 90-day period will not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, a business manager for the Department of the Attorney General is vitally necessary to the successful operation of the department occasioned by its growth and work; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated to the Department of the Attorney General from the General Fund the several sums shown below for the employment of a business manager. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 133

AN ACT Providing Funds for a Study of the Recreational and Transportation Aspects of Bicycling.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the recreational and transportation aspects of bicycling are limited or nonexistent during the colder or winter months; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the following study begin at once for any meaningful data during the height of such activity; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
