CHAPTER 34

RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of Copies of History of Millinocket.

History of Millinocket; purchase of copies. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$2,000 to purchase 200 copies of "Millinocket: A Magic City in Maine's Wilderness" by Dorothy Bowler Laverty, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the State Librarian.

Effective October 3, 1973

CHAPTER 35

RESOLVE, Appropriating Funds for the Perambulation of the Maine-New Hampshire Boundary Line.

Perambulation of Maine-New Hampshire Boundary Line; appropriation. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$10,000 to carry out the Revised Statutes, Title 23, chapter 13, subchapter X.

Effective October 3, 1973

CHAPTER 36

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Edgar W. Tupper of Madison for Loss of Beehives by Bear.

Edgar W. Tupper; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$1,600 to be paid to Edgar W. Tupper of Madison as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for loss of 43 beehives and honey destroyed by bear.

CHAPTER 37

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Aviation Oil Company for Tax Paid for Shrinkage of Motor Fuel.

Aviation Oil Company; appropriation for. Resolved: That there is appropriated the sum of \$2,177.95 from the General Highway Fund to Aviation Oil Company of Waterville in settlement of its claim against the State for refund for tax paid on account of shrinkage or loss by evaporation of motor fuel.
