RESOLVES
OF THE
STATE OF MAINE
AS PASSED BY THE
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Whereas, this road was not included in the Act which incorporated the roads and highways of Indian Township into the State Highway System; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Kennebassis Road, Indian Township; designated. Resolved: That the Department of Transportation be authorized and directed to designate as State Highway so much of Kennebassis Road, Indian Township, Washington County, which leads easterly from U. S. Route 1, as may be dedicated by appropriate authority and easements for highway use be granted by the abutting owners at the location and a width and lengths as may be approved by the Commissioner of Transportation from time to time; and be it further

Resolved: That there is allocated from the General Highway Fund the sum of \$15,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974 for the purpose of improving said highway as designated by this resolve. Any unexpended balance shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purpose of this resolve has been accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 58

RESOLVE, Providing Funds for the Maintenance of Ocean Beaches.

Appropriation; maintenance of ocean beaches. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$30,000 to the Towns of Scarborough, Old Orchard Beach and Saco, York County, to aid in the cost of cleaning, maintaining and improving the municipal ocean beaches of such towns. The breakdown shall be as follows:

CHAPTER 59

RESOLVE, to Locate the Public Lot in Township 2, Range 6 W.B.K.P., Franklin County.

Public lot to be located in T. 2, R. 6 W.B.K.P. Resolved: That the Forest Commissioner is authorized and directed to take such steps as are necessary or proper pursuant to the Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 4151 or the

Revised Statutes, Title 30, section 4153 to cause the public lot in Township 2, Range 6 W.B.K.P., Franklin County, to be located and that in locating said public lot, the Forest Commissioner shall, to the extent feasible include, but shall not be limited to, appropriate consideration of the following criteria :

1. Contiguousness to other public lands ;
2. Public recreation needs ;
3. Accessibility to roads, highways and other transportation ;
4. Proximity to centers of population ;
5. Needs of state agencies ;
6. Scenic quality ;
7. Value as to minerals ;
8. Value as to timber ;
9. The preservation of significant natural, recreational and historic resources, including wildlife habitat and other areas critical to the ecology of the State ;
10. The provisions of any applicable comprehensive or long-range management plan for use of public lands ; and be it further

Resolved: That the sum of \$10,535 be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Forestry Department to carry out the purposes of this resolve. This appropriation shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

CHAPTER 60

RESOLVE, Reimbursing Mars Hill Utility District for Bonds Issued for Sewer Construction.

Mars Hill Utility District; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$31,488 to be paid to the Mars Hill Utility District to be held and used by said district solely for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on certain Sewer Construction Serial and Term Bonds issued by said district in 1964.
