4. Construction of the bridge will not be authorized by the Department of Transportation until the Towns of Windham and Gorham, at a special town meeting in Windham to be held before August 1, 1974, and by the town council of Gorham before August 1, 1974, authorize the towns to execute the agreement with the State Department of Transportation, and further, if either or both towns fail to authorize the towns to enter into the agreement, the State of Maine will not be responsible for replacing Babb's Bridge, except under the provisions of the so-called General Bridge Act.

CHAPTER 87

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Gerald Perkins of Bucksport for Loss of Beehives by Bear.

Gerald Perkins; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$196.40 to be paid to Gerald Perkins of Bucksport as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for loss of beehives and honey destroyed by bear.

CHAPTER 88

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Glidden of Gardiner for Property Damages Caused by State Wards.

Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Glidden; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$503.38 to be paid to Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Glidden of Gardiner as a full and final settlement of their claim against the State for damages to their property caused by 2 state wards.

Effective June 28, 1974

CHAPTER 89

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Ansel Fowler, Sr., of Costigan for Loss of Beehives.

Ansel Fowler, Sr.; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$200 to reimburse Ansel Fowler, Sr., of Costigan as a full and final settlement of his claim against the State for loss of beehives destroyed by bears.
