CHAPTER 100

RESOLVE, Reimbursing the Town of Wade for Welfare Expenditures in Behalf of a Nonsettled State Case.

Town of Wade; reimbursed. Resolved: That there is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$3,552.24 to be paid to the Town of Wade to reimburse the town for welfare expenditures in behalf of a nonsettled state case for the period from May, 1969 to June, 1972.

CHAPTER 101

RESOLVE, Permitting the County of Kennebec to Expend Money for Public Ambulance Service.

Ambulance service; Kennebec County. Resolved: That the County Commissioners of Kennebec County are authorized to receive and expend funds to provide for public ambulance service within Kennebec County; and be it further

Resolved: That said commissioners may contract with either a profit or nonprofit agency or a municipality for the providing of ambulance service; and be it further

Resolved: That said commissioners may enter into reciprocal agreements with private, public and municipal agencies for ambulance service; and be it further

Resolved: That this resolve should not be construed to allow the commissioners in the several counties to provide a county operated and maintained ambulance service; and be it further

Resolved: That said commissioners may provide for said ambulance service only through a contractual basis; and be it further

Resolved: That the county commissioners of Kennebec County are authorized to appropriate up to \$100,000 from federal revenue sharing funds for public ambulance service for Kennebec County.

Effective June 28, 1974
