# PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS OF THE STATE OF MAINE

2032 CHAP. 67

Whereas, from January 1, 1975 to January 13, 1975, she continued to perform all her former duties, including but not limited to, the issuance of marriage licenses, dog licenses, certified copies of documents and the retention of all records of the Town Council; and

Whereas, as a result of the issuance of marriage licenses without authority, the legal status of various persons is in question; and

Whereas, it is deemed necessary and desirable to validate all such acts as Town Clerk; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Acts of a certain town clerk of Brunswick validated. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, all the acts of Sylvia B. Ouellette, acting as Clerk of the Town of Brunswick from January 1, 1975 to and including January 13, 1975, are hereby validated; and upon passage of this Act, the Town Clerk of Brunswick shall incorporate this validation into the official records of the Town of Brunswick.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

#### CHAPTER 67

AN ACT to Amend Certain Procedures for Issuing Bonds under the Charter of the York Beach Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P & SL 1901, c. 455, § 6, 1st sentence, as amended by P & SL 1917, c. 129, is further amended to read:

Said corporation at any legal meeting called for that purpose may by vote of not less than three fourths  $\frac{2}{3}$  of all voters present, vote to issue its bonds or notes to obtain money to carry out each, any or all of the objects and purposes set forth in sections two and three of this act as now amended.
