Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head; retirement status adjustment. Resolved: That notwithstanding any other provision of law, the rate of contributions, rights and benefits of Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head, under the Maine State Retirement System, shall be those of a law enforcement officer in the Department of Marine Resources during the period Albert W. Hallowell of Owls Head has served and continues to serve as a boat captain with the department.

Effective July 29, 1976

CHAPTER 45

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Bureau of Public Lands to Convey the State's Interest in 4 Lots in Kingman, Penobscot County.

Transfer title of the State for 4 lots in Kingman Township. Resolved: That the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands, Department of Conservation, is authorized to sell, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council, by quitclaim deed all right, title and interest of the State in Lots 14, 15 and 19 south of Marginal Street and Lot 4 north of Pine Street as laid down on Sewall's Tax Plans 3 and 2 of Kingman Township for an amount determined by the director to be fair market value. The director shall cause notice to be published of the availability of the said lots in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in advance of any sale thereof.

CHAPTER 46

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Exchange of Certain Public Reserved Lands.

Director of Bureau of Public Lands; authorized to consummate exchange of public reserved lands. Resolved: That the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands is authorized to consummate the exchange of the following public reserved lands:

Whereas J. M. Huber Corporation and the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands have entered into certain letter agreements dated February 12, 1976, hereinafter set forth as a part of this resolve, which contemplate an exchange of public reserved lands; therefore

The Director of the Bureau of Public Lands is authorized to consummate the letter agreements hereinafter set forth as a part of this resolve, and any

lands received by the State pursuant to said agreements shall be, for all purposes, public reserved lands of the State of Maine and shall be held by the State subject to the same terms and conditions as apply to other public reserved lands.

Please accept this letter as an indication of intent on the part of J. M. Huber Corporation to consummate the gift to the State of Maine as detailed below.

Gift: The J. M. Huber Corporation will make a charitable donation to the State of Maine of the following:

- 1. Huber ownership of Bigelow Mountain in Wyman Township, approximately as depicted on plan attached hereto. 5,261 acres
- 2. Huber ownership (undivided) in Township 10, Range 4, approximately as depicted on plan attached hereto. 1,184 acres
- 3. A portion of Huber ownership (undivided) in Township 11, Range 4, approximately as depicted on plan attached hereto. 6,361 acres
- 4. Huber interest in Public Lot in Township 10, Range 4. 44 acres
- 5. Huber interest in Public Lot in Township 11, Range 4. 500 acres

This gift is to be conveyed after legislative passage and signing of a Resolve by the Governor authorizing this agreement, but prior to March 15, 1976.

We will proceed at once with the preparation of the necessary documents.

Dear Lee:

Please accept this letter as an indication of intent on the part of J. M. Huber Corporation to consummate the trade with the State of Maine as detailed below.

Trade: J. M. Huber Corporation to the State of Maine:

- i. Huber ownership (undivided) in Township 11 Range 4, approximately as depicted on plan attached hereto. 1,215 acres

State of Maine to J. M. Huber Corporation:

- i. State ownership in Public Lots in the Township listed on attachment. 12,152 acres

The State of Maine shall covenant not to sue or collect damages from J. M. Huber Corporation for an accounting for rents and profits based upon any claim the State may now have or ever had against Huber arising from their respective interests in the public reserved lands in the unorganized townships of the State, the State expressly reserving from its covenant the right to pursue any claim it may have against persons or entities other than Huber.

This trade transaction to be accomplished as soon as formal State authorization is finalized and effective.

Presuming that this agrees with your understanding and is acceptable, I would appreciate your signing and returning the enclosed duplicate.

We will proceed at once with the preparation of the necessary documents.

I believe the above arrangement is one that is very much in the interests of the State of Maine and of J. M. Huber Corporation. We do appreciate the interest and competence shown by you and the Bureau of Public Lands

in bringing this to a successful conclusion.
