Sec. 3. 23 MRSA §§ 2401 - 2405 and § 2407 are repealed.

Sec. 4. 23 MRSA § 2954 is repealed.

Sec. 5. 23 MRSA § 3651, 1st sentence, is amended to read:

Highways, town ways and streets legally established shall be opened and kept in repair so as to be safe and convenient for travelers with motor vehicles ~~horses, teams and carriages~~.

Sec. 6. 23 MRSA § 3657 is repealed.

CHAPTER 364

AN ACT to Permit Farmers to Shoot Marauding Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 2354, sub-§ 7, as enacted by PL 1971, c. 231, § 5, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

7. Destruction of property. Except as provided in subsection 1 as it applies to deer, any person may lawfully kill, or cause to be killed, any wild animal night or day, except beaver or any wild bird, found in the act of attacking, worrying or wounding that person's domestic animals or destroying that person's property.

CHAPTER 365

AN ACT Relating to the Practice of Real Estate Brokers and Salesmen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 4056, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 767, §§ 55-58, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§ 4056. Investigations; hearings; suspension or revocation of license
