PUBLIC LAWS, 1977

Sec. 3. 3 MRSA § 173, sub-§ 3, ¶ B, first ¶, as amended by PL 1975, c. 771, § 14 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

A copy of the printed decisions of the Supreme Judicial Court, commonly called Maine Reports, and of the advance sheets, which are purchased by the State in accordance with Title 4, section 702, shall be distributed by the State Law Librarian to the following: Each county law library, each college library, each district attorney's office, each office of a judge of probate, each registry of probate, each office of a clerk of courts, each District Court, the office of each Senator and Representative from Maine in the Congress of the United States, each Justice and ex-Justice of the Supreme Judicial and Superior Courts, the office of the Governor, the office of the Judge of the United States District Court for Maine, the office of the United States District Court for Maine, and the office of the Clerk of the United States Court of Appeals for the first circuit.

CHAPTER 507

AN ACT to Provide for Adult Education for Certain Students under the Provisions of the School Finance Act of 1976.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

20 MRSA § 3748, sub-§ 1, [B, sub-[] (1), (2) and (3) are enacted to read:

(1) Any pupil between the ages of 16 and 20, who enrolls in an adult evening school program under guidelines established by the commissioner, shall be counted as .2 of a pupil.

(2) The unit in which such a student resides shall be reimbursed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

(3) When a unit does not offer an appropriate adult evening school course, the student may enroll in a neighboring unit or private school subject to the approval of the sending unit's superintendent of schools. The sending unit shall pay tuition to the receiving unit in an amount no greater than .a of the present per pupil subsidy allocation for secondary students in the sending unit.
