### CHAPTER 60

S. P. 155 — L. D. 330

AN ACT to Amend the Safe Drinking Water Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

22 MRSA § 2617, sub-§ 1, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 751, § 4, is amended by inserting at the end the following new sentence:

The District Court or the Superior Court shall have jurisdiction over violations of section 2616.

Effective September 14, 1979

#### CHAPTER 61

H. P. 235 — L. D. 281

AN ACT to Revise the Podiatric Practice Act.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA § 3553 is amended to read:

§ 3553. Narcotics

With the approval of the Bureau of Narcotics Drug Enforcement Administration, a podiatrist duly licensed in the State of Maine and a graduate of an accredited school of podiatry recognized by the National Association of Chiropodist American Podiatry Association, who has been granted a doctorate degree the degree of Doctor of Podiatric Medicine, shall be privileged to apply for license and therefore to prescribe narcotic drugs in the treatment of ailments of the human foot.

Sec. 1-A. 32 MRSA § 3601, 2nd sentence is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

One of the examiners shall be chosen by a majority of the examiners to act as chairman of the examiners for a term of 2 years and the secretary-treasurer of the Board of Registration in Medicine shall act as secretary-treasurer of the examiners.
