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The commissioner may permit depuration of shellfish not contaminated by paralytic shellfish poisoning if it is established that the water used during depuration will not contaminate the shellfish with paralytic shellfish poisoning.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

CHAPTER 250

S. P. 351 — L. D. 1099

AN ACT to Define Educational Institutions as they Relate to the Unemployment Compensation System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1043, sub-§ 29, is enacted to read:

29. Educational institution. "Educational institution" means any school, including nursery schools and schools of higher education, which is licensed by the State and which provides an organized course of study designed to transfer knowledge, skills, attitudes or abilities under the guidance of a teacher.

CHAPTER 251

S. P. 441 — L. D. 1334

AN ACT Relating to the Location of the Office of Superintendent of Insurance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

24-A MRSA § 204 as last amended by PL 1973, c. 585, § 12 is repealed.
