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Treasury shall be upon the authorization of the State Controller and the Treasurer of State, as evidenced by their facsimile signatures, except that the Treasurer of State may authorize interbank and intrabank transfers for purposes of pooled investments. CHAPTER 313

S. P. 199 — L. D. 495

AN ACT Relating to Occupational Loss of Hearing.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

39 MRSA § 193, sub-§ 3, 2nd sentence, as enacted by PL 1967, c. 374, § 6, is amended to read:

Hearing levels shall be measured by means of pure-tone ~~ear-conduction~~ **air-conduction** audiometric instruments calibrated in accordance with American Standard ~~Z24.5, 1951, American Standards Association, March 21, 1951~~ **National Standards Institute Standard S3.22-1976**, and in an area with ambient noise level within the limits specified in American Standards Association Criteria for Background Noise in Audiometric Room S3.1, 1960.

CHAPTER 314

S. P. 206 — L. D. 538

AN ACT to Prevent Cruelty to Animals by Establishing Certain Licensing Categories and Restrictions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

7 MRSA § 3451, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 696, § 104, is further amended by adding after the 11th paragraph which begins "Boarding kennel" a new paragraph to read:

The commissioner shall not issue a license to maintain a kennel, boarding
