CHAPTER 728
H. P. 1789 — L. D. 1908

AN ACT Relating to Budgetary Hardship in Maintaining Special Education Students.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

20 MRSA § 4749, sub-§ 6, ¶ A, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 625, § 8, is repealed and the followed enacted in its place:

A. If an administrative unit petitions the commissioner and demonstrates that the unexpected costs of placement for educational purposes of a student in a special education program will cause a budgetary hardship, the commissioner may adjust the unit's allocation to include an amount not to exceed the educational cost of the placement under rules and regulations established by the commissioner.

CHAPTER 729
H. P. 1833 —L. D. 1937

AN ACT to Increase Trapping Fees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 7131, as last amended by PL 1979, c. 543, § 13, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 7133 is enacted to read:

§ 7133. Trapping license

1. Eligibility.

A. Any resident 16 years of age or older is eligible to purchase a resident trapping license.

B. Any resident 10 years of age or older and under 16 years is eligible to purchase a resident junior trapping license.

C. Any resident under 10 years of age may trap without a license.

D. Any nonresident is eligible to purchase a nonresident trapping license.

2. Issuance. The commissioner may issue a license to engage in trapping.

3. Expiration. A resident junior trapping license issued to a person who has passed his 15th birthday is valid through the calendar year for which the license was issued.

4. Schedule of fees.

A. Resident trapping \$25

B. Resident junior trapping..... \$5
(10 years of age or older and under 16 years)

C. Nonresident trapping.....\$300

5. Restrictions.

A. Any resident under 10 years of age shall be accompanied, at all times while trapping, by a parent or guardian or an adult approved by a parent or guardian.

Sec. 3. 12 MRSA § 7352, sub-§ 2, as repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 543, § 32, is amended to read:

2. Fee. The annual fee for a hide dealer's license shall be ~~\$34~~ \$50 for residents of this State and ~~\$68~~ \$100 for nonresidents.

CHAPTER 730

H. P. 1780 — L. D. 1902

AN ACT to Enable the State to Protect the People of Maine and its Natural Environment from Damages Resulting from the Discharge of Hazardous Matter.
