Sec. 4. Limitation. This Act shall not be construed to grant rights to any employee or trustee of the Bingham Water District or to any former employee or trustee of the Bingham Water District now receiving retirement benefits who is declared ineligible for retirement benefits by a final judicial determination.

CHAPTER 90

H. P. 2031 — L. D. 2035

AN ACT Relating to the State Valuation of the Town of Patten.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, county taxes are based upon the state valuation; and

Whereas, the county tax rate must be established by April 1, 1980; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary this legislation be passed as an emergency in order to become effective prior to April 1, 1980; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town of Patten; state valuation. For the purpose of determining the amount of school subsidies to which School Administrative District No. 25 shall be eligible to receive for the fiscal year 1980-81 and apportionment of county taxes for fiscal year 1980 and any other applications where state aid or subsidies are required, the state valuation of the Town of Patten shall be set at \$11,100,000. Such valuation shall be used in the determination of the per pupil valuation of the Town of Patten as set forth by statute.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
