Except as to covered claims arising under workmen's compensation policies, the obligation of the association shall not extend to any portion of a covered claim which exceeds the lesser of the obligation of the insurer, now insolvent, under the policy from which the claim arises, or ~~\$50,000~~ **\$150,000**.

CHAPTER 18

H. P. 96 — L. D. 126

AN ACT to Extend the Sunset Provision on the Regulation of Business Between Motion Picture Distributors and Exhibitors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

10 MRSA § 1905, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 266, is amended to read:

§ 1905. Effective for 4 years

This chapter shall be effective for a period of ~~2~~ **4** years from the effective date of the chapter.

CHAPTER 19

H. P. 98 — L. D. 128

AN ACT to Increase the Licensing Fees for Chiropractors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 553, first sentence, as last amended by PL 1973, c. 65, § 1, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Any person to whom a certificate has been granted under section 552 who wishes to renew that certificate shall, on or before the first day of June of each year, pay to the secretary of the board a license renewal fee not in excess of \$50 as established by the board. Upon payment of the fee that person's certificate shall be renewed for one year.
