CHAPTER 142

H. P. 471 — L. D. 524

AN ACT Concerning the Interest Charge on Outstanding County Taxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

36 MRSA § 892-A, 2nd ¶, 2nd sentence, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 27, § 8, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

The rate of interest may not exceed the rate of interest established by the State Tax Assessor under section 186. Interest may not be charged a municipality before the date set by the municipality under section 505 for charging interest on delinquent taxes.

CHAPTER 143

H. P. 607 — L. D. 684

AN ACT to Provide for a Transition before the Attorney General takes Office.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 191-A is enacted to read:

§ 191-A. Transition period

In order to provide for an orderly transition following the biennial election of the Attorney General, the Attorney General-elect shall not take the oath of his office or otherwise qualify for the office for a period of no less than 30 days following that election.
