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CHAPTER 194

H. P. 596 — L. D. 673

AN ACT to Include Energy and Economic Considerations in Assessing Proposals before the Land Use Regulation Commission, the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA § 685-B, sub-§ 4, last ¶, as amended by PL 1973, c. 569, § 11, is further amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

The commission shall permit the applicant to provide evidence on the economic benefits of the proposal as well as the impact of the proposal on energy resources.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA § 7777, sub-§ 2, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, § 1, is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

The commissioner shall permit the applicant to provide evidence on the economic benefits of the proposal as well as the impact of the proposal on energy resources.

Sec. 3. 38 MRSA § 484, 2nd ¶, 2nd sentence, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 240, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

The board shall permit the applicant to provide evidence on the economic benefits of the proposal as well as the impact of the proposal on energy resources.

CHAPTER 195

S. P. 183 — L. D. 461

AN ACT Further Amending the Planning and Zoning Statute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

30 MRSA § 4956, sub-§ 4, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 696, § 226, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

All subdivision plats and plans required by this section shall contain the name and address of the person under whose responsibility the subdivision plat or plan was prepared.
