CHAPTER 497
H. P. 699 — L. D. 824

AN ACT Relating to Eligibility for World War Assistance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 37-A MRSA § 29, first sentence, as amended by PL 1975, c. 701, § 20, is further amended to read:

Aid shall be granted under sections 28 to 37 to a single veteran residing in the State who is in dire need and to the needy spouse, child or parent or parents, residing in the State, of a veteran, who if living, is disabled and a resident of the State or who is deceased.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
