Sec. 4. 32 MRSA §2055, 4th ¶, as amended by PL 1965, c. 226, §75, is further amended to read:

Applicants failing the first examination may apply and take the next or ~~subsequent~~ subsequently scheduled examination upon payment of the required application fee. ~~A no additional fee privilege for a 2nd examination shall extend only through the date of the next annual examination.~~

Sec. 5. 32 MRSA §2058, last sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 360, §28, is amended to read:

Lost licenses shall be replaced on application by the licensed arborist and payment of ~~\$1~~ \$2.

Sec. 6. 32 MRSA §2059, as amended by PL 1977, c. 360, §29, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§2059. Fees

A \$25 fee shall accompany each application for examination and shall not be returnable. When an applicant is notified that he is eligible for a license following examination, he shall remit an additional \$20 to cover the biennial license fee of \$20 before a license is issued.

The fee for a biennial renewal license shall be \$20.

C. Subject to section 378.

Sec. 4. 27 MRSA §378 is enacted to read:

§378. Emergency site designation

In the case of an area containing archaeological materials or artifacts on private property which is directly threatened with unauthorized excavation, the Director of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission, with the written permission of the landowner, may designate such an area a site which shall be subject to this chapter for a period not to exceed one year. All sites given emergency designation under this section shall be posted against unauthorized excavation. Notice of the designation shall be filed with the registrar of deeds in the county in which the site is located.
