CHAPTER 70

S. P. 308 — L. D. 864

AN ACT in Support of Regional Library Systems.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

These funds are to be allocated to designated area reference and resource centers by the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, with the advice of the Maine Library Commission. This financial support is based on written plans and reports detailing the ways by which the area reference and resource centers intend to achieve such goals as direct free access to district residents, WATS service to member libraries, interlibrary loan service; reference service and such other cooperative activities as member libraries may need.
