CHAPTER 88

S.P. 868 - L.D. 2013

**AN ACT to Amend the Terms of the Directors
of the Auburn Water and Sewerage Districts.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the City of Auburn desires to reduce the terms of the trustees of the sewerage and water districts in order to provide more accountability to the local citizens; and

Whereas, appointments are made by the city council in March, so that any charter change must be made before then if the next appointments are to follow the new requirements; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1917, c. 193, §1, 4th sentence is amended to read:

The trustees of the Auburn Sewerage District hereby created shall each hold office according to the respective terms of office which they now hold ~~as members of the Auburn Water Commissioners,~~ and upon the expiration of said terms of office one trustee ~~trustees~~ shall thereafterwards be elected annually as follows in the month of March by the city council of Auburn to serve for a term of 6 4 years.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1917, c. 193, §1, as amended by P&SL 1919, c. 82, is further amended by adding after the 4th sentence a new sentence to read:

One trustee shall be appointed in 1982; one trustee shall be appointed in 1983; one trustee shall be appointed in 1984 and every 4 years thereafter; one trustee shall be appointed in 1985 and every 4 years thereafter; 2 trustees shall be

appointed in 1986 and every 4 years thereafter; and 2 trustees shall be appointed in 1987 and every 4 years thereafter.

Sec. 3. P&SL 1923, c. 60, §4, 2nd sentence is amended to read:

The 6 trustees, exclusive of the mayor of the city of Auburn, shall each hold office according to the respective terms of office which they now hold as members of the Auburn Water Commissioners, and upon the expiration of said term terms of office one trustee trustees shall thereafterwards be elected annually as follows in the month of March by the city council of the city of Auburn for a term of ~~6~~ 4 years.

Sec. 4. P&SL 1923, c. 60, §4, is amended by adding after the 3rd sentence a new sentence to read:

One trustee shall be appointed in 1982; one trustee shall be appointed in 1983; one trustee shall be appointed in 1984 and every 4 years thereafter; one trustee shall be appointed in 1985 and every 4 years thereafter; 2 trustees shall be appointed in 1986 and every 4 years thereafter; and 2 trustees shall be appointed in 1987 and every 4 years thereafter.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

Effective March 15, 1982.

CHAPTER 89

H.P. 1751 - L.D. 1741

AN ACT to Allocate Funds from the Low-level Waste Siting Fund.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Low-level Waste Siting Commission is meeting on a regular basis; and
