## CHAPTER 102

H.P. 1908 - L.D. 1897

### AN ACT to Make Additional Allocations From the Regulatory Fund, Public Utilities Commission for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1983.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the department will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1982; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

**Allocation from the Regulatory Fund; Public Utilities Commission.** Income not otherwise allocated from the Regula-

tory Fund, Public Utilities Commission is allocated for the fiscal year July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983 and shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as designated in the following schedule:

This makes additional allocations from the Regulatory Fund, Public Utilities Commission. Legislative allocation is required by Title 35, section 17, subsection 2.

## CHAPTER 103

H.P. 2097 - L.D. 2031

AN ACT to Revise the Charter of the  
Brunswick Sewer District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1947, c. 77, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
