CHAPTER 107

H.P. 1970 - L.D. 1945

AN ACT to Revise the Greater Portland Public Development Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1945, c. 123, §3 is amended to read:

Sec. 3. Management. Said The corporation shall be is managed by a board of 5 directors who shall be are citizen residents of Portland and/ or South Portland and who shall be are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of his council for a term of 5 years, except that in the first appointment one director shall be is appointed for 4 one year, one for 2 years, one for 3 years, one for 4 years, and one for 5 years. Directors are chosen so that the residencies of the members of the board of directors are, as nearly as possible, in proportion to the corporation's relative property holdings, based on fair market value, in the 2 municipalities at the time of the appointment; provided that at all times no less than 2 directors shall be residents of Portland and no less than 2 directors shall be residents of South Portland. Before making an appointment, the Governor shall consult with the city council of the municipality from which the director is chosen. The council shall nominate 3 candidates from among whom the Governor makes the appointment. Said The directors shall elect or appoint such officers agents as they shall determine are necessary and for the transaction of the business of the corporation.

H.P. 2257 - L.D. 2105

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the Lucerne-in-Maine Village Corporation.
