Sec. 7. P&SL 1927, c. 43, §12, 7th sentence, as repealed and replaced by P&SL 1979, c. 30, §6, is amended to read:

Each year a document entitled "Lucerne-In-Maine Village Corporation Ballot for Election of Officers and/or Referendum Questions" shall be mailed to all voters prior to the ~~annual~~ summer meeting and may be mailed to all voters prior to the annual ~~winter~~ meeting.

Sec. 8. P&SL 1927, c. 43, §16, first sentence, as amended by P&SL 1979, c. 30, §7, is further amended to read:

In the event of the death or resignation of any overseer or officer, his place may be filled by vote of a majority of the board of overseers, and the new officer or overseer so elected shall hold his office until the next annual or summer or winter meeting at which time said the office shall become vacant and his successor shall be elected at that meeting.

CHAPTER 109

S.P. 832 - L.D. 1940

AN ACT making Allocations Related to the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 1983.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated

from the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983.

Provides for alcohol abuse services. The allocation recognizes that \$89,000 remains in the fiscal year 1982 allocation. These resources are available to the department to provide \$34,000 for alcoholism services in mental retardation programs; \$25,000 to Bangor Mental Health Institute; \$25,000 for Augusta Mental Health Institute for alcoholism services in programs in those institutions; and \$5,000 is for training in the existing homebuilders program. The contracts for these services will be made in fiscal year 1982 but will provide services in fiscal year 1982 and 1983. It is the legislative intent that the Department of Finance and Administration and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall maintain one account for funds allocated from this fund and it shall be the responsibility of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to use these funds in the following areas and in the amounts indicated:

Sec. 2. Coordination. The Department of Corrections, Department of Educational and Cultural Services, Department of Human Services and Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation shall coordinate to the greatest extent possible their goals, education, treatment, training, prevention and research programs. Before expending any education and training funds a department shall submit the plans for the program to a joint planning group established by the departments to ensure coordination of policy and service.

Sec. 3. Accountability. The departments shall report to the Legislature by January 30, 1983 the actions taken pursuant to the allocations contained in this Act. The report shall include a description of each program and actions taken expending funds for alcoholism prevention, training, education, treatment and research. The funds expended shall be identified as to source whether federal, state or private grants. In addition, the departments shall provide a report on drug abuse including a description of all programs and expenditures of all funds. The reports may

include recommendations and outline issues which the Legislature and the departments may wish to address.

CHAPTER 110

H.P. 2331 - L.D. 2139

AN ACT to Allow the Mapleton Sewer District to Charge the Full Cost Incurred in Filing a Lien.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

P&SL 1965, c. 77, §24, 2nd ¶, last 2 sentences are amended to read:

At the time of the recording of any such certificate in the registry of deeds as heretofore provided, the treasurer shall file in the office of the district a true copy of such certificate and shall mail a true copy thereof by registered or certified mail to each record holder of any mortgage on said real estate, addressed to such record holder at his last and usual place of abode. The fee to be charged by the district to the ratepayer for such notice and filing shall not exceed \$1.50 and the actual cost of notice and filing plus the fee to be charged to the district by the register of deeds for filing and recording shall not exceed \$1.
